

COUNT UMBERTO CAPRONI DI TALIEDO

Count Umberto Caproni di Taliedo, of Milan, is a member of the British Falconry Club. He spends two months grouse hawking in Scotland each year, and is shown here in a hunting lodge with a peregrine falcon on the fist.

The Italian Falconers

Umberto Caproni, Fulco Tosti and Ferrante (Frikki) Pratesi.

These three Italians started to hawk together as teenagers and with the help of Ernesto Coppaloni saved falconry from disappearing in Italy. They successfully flew partridge and after reading articles about Geoffrey Pollards grouse hawking decided to try it for themselves. They rented some ground from Lord Thurso in Caithness in 1967 and Umberto and Frikki drove from Italy to Scotland with six brooki peregrines in a Porsche. They struggled to kill grouse in their first season but were invited out with Stephen Frank and Roger Upton and soon got successes. Their hawks flew at very high pitches and influenced the British falconers of the time with the style of height. The next year they returned and were showing how it should be done. Umberto, because of family business, didn't come over for a few years and was replaced by Frikki's cousin Fulco, by the late 1970's they were all grouse hawking every year. With lack of quarry in Italy they completely moved their hawking to the UK and between them they grouse hawked in Scotland every season from 1967 to 2014. Most seasons they took at least 100 brace of grouse between them and flew some of the best peregrines I have seen fly. Style was always very important and they gave their hawk's great opportunity. Umberto has been a great patron of the sport sponsoring several falconry books, contributing to the American Archives of Falconry and importing two very important Italian pointers whose blood has influenced the pointer breeding over here. Frikki is a past president of the IAF and all three are extremely highly thought of in Europe and America where they influenced falconry a great deal.

They have now retired from hawking.








The figure in the white suit in the foreground can probably be identified as King Willem III.

Painter of historical and contemporary scenes, Rochussen belonged to the intimates of King Willem II.

While he had earlier enjoyed the favours of the Crown prince, when the latter became King, Rochussen was frequently invited to Het Loo, where all kinds of events were recorded by him in watercolours and drawings. (cf. literature: Cornelis Veth, *Charles Rochussen*, Rotterdam 1947, and compare with the larger composition of almost the identical subject of cat.no. 556, *L'oeuvre de Charles Rochussen*, Rotterdam 1894, by D. Franken and F.D.O. Obreen)


The Royal Loo Hawking Club 1839-1855

BY DR. J. W. M. VAN DE WALL

Yesterday evening we could not start before eight o'clock because of rain and wind; today it is still raining. It is now six o'clock and still raining but we shall wait till sunset. Falconry is worth watching and it is very interesting to see how the falcons are trained. The falconers are dressed in uniforms resembling those of the times of King Louis XIII of France; they are very attractive and simple. Those present at this moment are: The Duke of Leeds, Mr. Worthley and his wife, two Messrs. Newcome, Baron d'Offémont,





Notes:

The Falconers' Society, later The Falconers' Club, was founded in 1770. Meetings were held every April for kite and crow hawking. In 1783, the establishment consisted of 32 slight falcons (or peregrin), 13 German hawks (goshawks) and 7 Iceland falcons. Colonel Thornton was manager of the club and after George Walpole's death in 1791 the Club was controlled by Lord Berners. The Club later became known as the 'High Ash Club'. Heron hunting continued as a popular sport until the mid-19th Century.

The present painting is inscribed on the reverse, in an old hand, *Two celebrated Greyhounds property of/ Col. Thornton/ Philip Reinagle. R.A.*

Colonel Thomas Thornton (1755-1823) was one of the most extravagant figures of the late 18th century in England. A hard drinking, reckless gambler who was fond of women, Thornton nevertheless patronized some of the leading sporting artists of the age, including Reinagle, George Stubbs, Stephen Elmer and George Garrad. Reinagle collaborated with Sawrey Gilpin to produce the celebrated portrait of Thornton out shooting in 1796 (see S. Deuchar, *Sporting Art in Eighteenth-Century England*, 1988, pl. 113).

Colonel Thomas Thornton

1747–1823

Colonel Thomas Thornton was perhaps the most flamboyant sportsman and falconer of Britain's 18th century. Born near St. James in 1747, his father died when he was 22 leaving him with an immense fortune. In 1772 he founded The Confederate Hawks of Great Britain ("The Falconers' Club"), a *de facto* revival of British falconry after the Puritan-inspired hiatus of over a century. Lord Orford took over the management of the club upon the retirement of Colonel Thornton in 1781 when club members presented Colonel Thornton with the now-famed special silver-gilt tea urn.

A contemporary account may best describe at least some of the attributes and accomplishments of this renowned sportsman:

Thornville Royal (Thornton's estate) was always the scene of festive hospitality; and no gentleman was calculated to do the honors of the table better than the late Colonel Thornton. His diversified talents, his quickness of repartee, his facetious stories on all topics and his good-natured acquiescence with the request of his guests, rendered the table of the Colonel the great resort of the neighbouring noblemen and gentlemen: his wines were always of the first quality; and the Colonel was no flincher from his glass; indeed, he had obtained the character of being a 'six-bottle man'. He was very much attached to works of art and few houses had to boast of a more diversified and choice collection of paintings than Thornville Royal.

His whole life was devoted to sports of the field. He showed great partiality for falconry, being determined to bring the sport to the height of perfection but his sporting interests and abilities were varied. In a walking match, he went four miles in thirty-two minutes and a half a second. He was able to

jump his own height (5 feet, 9 inches)—in response to a considerable wager. In another match he jumped over six five-barred gates in six minutes, then repeating the same feat on horseback. With respect to shooting, either with fowling-piece, rifle or air-gun, Colonel Thornton has given the most incontestable proofs of the steadiness of his hand and the wonderful correctness of his sight, not only in bringing down the game, but also at the mark, in which his precision has never been surpassed.

This gentleman was not only devoted to the pursuits of Actaeon and the pleasures of Bacchus, but Venus and Cupid were likewise his idols, having in the autumn of 1806 (after a notable series of amorous adventures), led to the altar a Miss Cawston of Essex, an accomplished young lady of some fortune.

Nonetheless, with financial difficulties Thornton finally retired to France in 1815, renting the less than grand Chateau of Chambord and purchasing an estate on the Pont-sur-Seine, where he styled himself "Prince de Chambord" and "Duc de Pont." In 1817 he moved to rented quarters in Paris and founded a "Falconers' Club," primarily devoted to dining, drinking and singing hunting songs. A

sportsman to the end, he ordered out his hounds and with his horse waiting at the door, Thornton died on March 10th, 1823.

It was evident that the Colonel had imbibed one opinion: "Time is precious: life is but a span; we should therefore make the best use of it!" Whatever anyone may think of Thornton's multitude of idiosyncrasies, the falconry community is forever in his debt for his role in preserving the sport in the British Isles. The world can hardly expect to see another sportsman the likes of Colonel Thomas Thornton.

Autodidatta, Sirio Tofanari si dedica specialmente alla scultura di animali. Attivo anche a Parigi e a Londra, dove studia nel giardino zoologico e nel Museo di Storia Naturale a South Kensington. Espone alla Promotrice di Belle Arti di Torino dal 1908 e nello stesso anno a Faenza, dove riscuote un notevole consenso. Nel 1909, alla Mostra di Venezia, una sua opera viene acquistata per la Galleria d'Arte Moderna di Firenze. Nel 1911 espone a Barcellona, vincendo una medaglia d'oro e vendendo un'opera al museo della città, e nel 1915 a San Francisco. Alla Fiorentina Primaverile del 1922 presenta otto bronzi e una traduzione in argento di soggetto animale, mentre a Venezia nel 1934 propone *Somarello* e *Gazzella*. Alcune sue opere sono conservate nelle gallerie d'Arte Moderna di Firenze (*Carezza*, 1909, e *Gufo*), di Milano e in quella Nazionale di Roma (*Antilope morente*, 1935).
