The reason being that most of the equipment is made by club members and supplied at cost of material only. This is a "members only" service and the goods are not available outside the club on those prices.

After months of trial and erfor one of our members, Gordon Gower, has managed to make pairs of Goshawk bells. This is a remarkable achievement when you consider that the art of bell making has been limited to a mere handful of Oriental and European metal working experts. Most bells available in this country have to be imported and undoubtedly this announcement will cause great interest to falconers in Great Britain and our European friends.

Many congratulations, Gordon. Incidentally, Lorant de Bastyai has tried these bells and confirms that they are absolutely first rate and up to the standards of bells he has had from all over the world.
